Being Grace Church

Thank you for picking up our Fall 2012 Schedule of opportunities for involvement, growth, and service in Grace Church. Please take time to read through the wide assortment of ways you could invest your time and energy this Fall while growing as a disciple of Jesus Christ. We're all about discipleship at Grace Church, and we think our fall offerings provide ample opportunities for you to dig deeper and move forward.

I have spent many long hours wrestling behind closed doors with the issue of how well Grace Church is operating in our ever-changing culture. My concern has led me to spend extra time reading, thinking, and praying about our direction and effectiveness. Part of this arises from the fact that Grace Church came into existence on March 31, 1963. Allow me to explain why that is very important to our church family.

It usually takes some maturity, but eventually people can accept the fact that we're not going to live forever on the earth. When statistics enter the discussion of death, a pattern of life cycles emerges. Under normal circumstances, life begins as a baby and progresses through the stages of childhood, adolescence, young adulthood, middle age, and eventually reaches the golden years.

Churches, too, experience a predictable life cycle composed of emerging, growing, consolidating, declining, and dying stages. Only those churches that make the necessary adjustments along their life cycle remain healthy and achieve long-term success.

Dr. Gary L. McIntosh, an expert in church growth, says, "The pattern of growth (in churches) lasts from just a few years to perhaps a maximum of fifty years, although for most congregations growth stops between the twentieth and twenty-fifth year." That's a crucial and scary observation, because Grace Church will have existed for fifty years as of March 31, 2013.

So the question naturally arises, "Is Grace Church on a downward slide, since we are at that fifty year mark?" Addressing that concern has forced me to look back to the time at which we were founded and determine if we're remaining true to the purpose for which we came into existence.

On March 31, 1963, several couples met in a home in Wichita Falls and signed a document declaring their intention to form Grace Church, whose purpose was expressed in six distinct statements:

- To stand unequivocally for the fundamentals of the Faith as contained in the Holy Scriptures;
- To present the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ at home and abroad to those who have not accepted Him as their personal Savior;
- To teach the Holy Scriptures for the edification of those who have accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Savior;
- To minister to those among us who are in need;
- To meet together for worship, for instruction, for fellowship, and communion at the Lord's Table;
 and
- To do all things in the name of and for the honor and glory of our Savior, the King of Kings, Lord of Lords, even Jesus Christ.

As a Leadership Team, we're going to look closely during the next year at the degree to which we are remaining true to the original purposes for our very existence. We can't wait until that evaluation is complete, however, to keep growing as disciples of Jesus Christ.

We are still very much in process as a church, but we are committed to giving preeminence to Jesus by teaching the Scriptures and manifesting His grace in all we do. What we are—and become—as a church family may not please the world, but we are committed to being what the Lord wants us to be in order to reach our corner of it.

As Chuck Colson once stated, "The best thing the church can give to the world is to be the church."



Music and Message

Music is a universal form of communication. One cannot escape its influence or the emotional response it produces. It has the power to cross language barriers and change lives. A single note of a familiar melody may produce a flood of reactions, and this is where my passion for music begins.

The idea of leading any kind of music has always filled me with fear, but where I am weak He is strong. One song can strike an entire congregation on many different levels and lead us all to the same conclusion: that our worship time is for God, about God, and directed entirely to God. To Him be the glory.

Our Sunday morning teaching topics this fall will be the values held at Grace Church followed by a study of the book of Colossians. It is important that the music and the message share certain themes so that worship doesn't simply stop after the music or begin with the message. Rather, it is our goal for the whole service to be united in purpose.

In the coming months, our music will be centered on the values of Grace Church—music that identifies a loving relationship with Jesus Christ as our priority, music that encourages us to love others, music that is true to the Scriptures, and music that is focused on grace.

Our songs will also be focused on the fact that we are reconciled to Him through His blood, as we read in Colossians. Together, we will proclaim that He is the head of the church, that we are new creatures after having trusted Christ as our Savior, that we are to put on the new self, and that we are to give Him complete control.

These are wonderful things to sing about and I am excited to be on this journey with you.

Worship Services

During our two Sunday morning services at 9:00 or 10:30 AM, we will meet with God to worship Him through music and the study of two topics: our four church values (see page 18) and the Epistle to the Colossians.

Growing Together

We want to help parents and individuals to grow their faith and to improve their families. This desire grows out of our church values: loving relationships with Jesus Christ, ministry centered in the lives of people, life-related Bible teaching, and embodying grace.

Our mid-week programs are offered to provide additional opportunities for adults and students to grow as mature disciples of Jesus Christ. Sometimes these classes are practical, family-oriented studies that incorporate large-group learning and small-group discussions. Our adult mid-week studies are structured differently from Sunday morning Bible Fellowships. Adults of all ages and life stages attend our Wednesday classes together.

Our student activities are distinct from Sundays, as well. These programs include time for students to discharge excess energy before settling in for Bible study, and their friends won't feel left out if they attend.

In short, mid-week programs at Grace Church allow participants to connect with others while growing as a disciple. We encourage you to take advantage of these opportunities.

Adults

Our mid-week Bible and family classes provide opportunities to address specific topics and areas of interest throughout the year.

In this topical study, Brandon Carpenter will examine what's next on the prophetic timetable. History

Grace Church began in 1962 when six families started a Sunday night home Bible study taught by Dallas Theological Seminary student Dale Younce. In early 1963, the families decided that God was leading them to begin a new local church, and Grace Church came into existence.

At that time, we were meeting in the old First Christian Church education building at Tenth and Travis. As the Lord continued to bless us, we acquired a site on Cedar Elm Lane and, in 1973, moved into our first church-owned building. By 1976, we had grown to the point of needing a second full-time pastor.

The next landmark came when the tornado of April 10, 1979 destroyed our building. But God graciously provided a new facility—much larger than the previous one, and fully paid for by the time we occupied it in 1980. In the spring of 2004, we moved from our location on Cedar Elm Lane to our current location on Stone Lake Drive.

Regardless of our location, the original vision of a local independent Bible study ministry has remained intact, but it has expanded to include the importance of living the Word out in our relationships with believers and unbelievers alike.

Doctrinal Statement

We believe that Jesus Christ is the unique Son of God, who died for our sins as a substitutionary sacrifice and physically rose from the grave three days later. All those who trust Christ as their personal savior are redeemed and are members of the worldwide body of Christ. We welcome all who hold this belief as brothers and sisters in the Lord, and invite them to become part of our fellowship. (John 1:1–14, 3:16; Acts 16:31; 1 Corinthians 12:12–13; Ephesians 2:8–10; Colossians 1:14–20)

Furthermore, we believe that the Bible unequivocally teaches a number of additional doctrines, although we recognize that in some cases sincere and intelligent Christians hold different views. **Due to space constraints, the complete list of these doctrines is available on our website.** In order for unity to prevail within Grace Church (*Acts 4:32; Philippians 1:27, 2:1–2*), we require that all those in positions of leadership and teaching must personally hold to these basic precepts. However, if you disagree with some aspects of them, you are still welcome to be part of our church family.

Church Government

Jesus Christ is the head of Grace Church (*Colossians 1:18, 2:9*). Under His headship, we are governed by a plurality of elders, who are men called by the Holy Spirit to oversee the life of the church. Each of our elders is recognized by the existing group after an extensive process which includes examination of his Christian maturity and Bible knowledge in light of the qualifications set forth in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1, a period of internship, and consideration of feedback received from the entire congregation.

Membership

The universal church consists of all who have put their faith in Jesus Christ as personal savior. No local church can confer or withdraw this membership. We believe, however, that regular participation in the life of a local church is vitally important for every believer, and we encourage you to make this type of personal commitment.

Although there is nothing Biblically wrong with formal church membership, for several reasons we have adopted the policy of having no formal Grace Church membership roll. Instead, we welcome anyone who has personally trusted Jesus Christ as savior, and who wishes to identify with Grace Church, to "join" through regular participation with us.

Our Mission

We exist to raise up mature disciples of Jesus Christ.

Our Vision

We will foster a greater sense of belonging to our church family as we engage the needs of our community.

- Our priority is a loving relationship with Jesus Christ. (Luke 10:38–42)
